## Riparian Proper Functioning Condition (PFC) Workshop

You are invited to attend a Riparian Proper Functioning Condition (PFC) Assessment Workshop, sponsored by the US EPA Region 9, Pala Band of Mission Indians, and the La Jolla Band of Luiseno Indians. This workshop is designed for tribal staff involved in (or with future plans for) natural resource and/or water quality monitoring programs. This workshop outlines the Riparian PFC Assessment method, an assessment and management tool designed to help staff determine the health of their waterways.

This FREE 2 ½ day workshop will be held at the Pala Band of Mission Indians' Reservation, with field sites in the San Luis Rey Watershed. Pala is located in northern San Diego County, California (45 minutes north of San Diego), and is indicative of rural watersheds in more arid climates. EPA Pesticide Program Updates

from EPA's Office of Pesticide Programs 03/17/2010

WASHINGTON – Due to a significant increase in adverse incidents, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is taking a series of actions to increase the safety of spot-on pesticide products for flea and tick control for cats and dogs. Immediately, EPA will begin reviewing labels to determine which ones need stronger and clearer labeling statements. Next, EPA will develop more stringent testing and evaluation requirements for both existing and new products. EPA expects these steps will help prevent adverse reactions. In dogs and cats that can include skin effects, such as irritation, redness, or gastrointestinal problems that include vomiting or diarrhea, or effects to the nervous system, such as trembling, appearing depressed or seizures—from pet spot-on products.
